



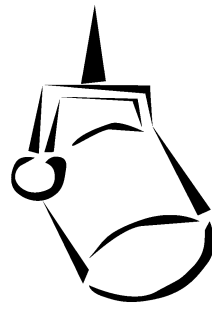
# SUMMER THEATRE WORKSHOP

**A**llegheny College announces the seventh annual **Summer Theatre Workshop**. The goal of the workshop is to expose high school students to all aspects of theatre performance with special

emphasis on acting, movement and dance, and vocal technique and singing. Students are immersed in a week full of rich theatrical experiences. Specialized skills are developed in classes and workshops taught by faculty members of the Allegheny Theatre Department and Dance and Movement Studies Department.

**S**tudents will split their time between classes and rehearsal. The week culminates in an evening performance created during the workshop. All interested high school students are invited to attend this workshop. No prior training is necessary.

**T**his year's workshop will be the first to take advantage of the facilities in our new Vukovich Center for Communication Arts, with its highly functional and attractive rehearsal and instructional areas, a garden roof that provides a stunning setting for informal activities, and the Gladys Mullenix Black Theatre, a jewel of a performance space.

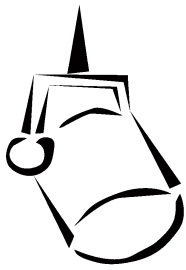

## Spotlight on the Faculty

### **Daniel Crozier**

is an associate professor of theatre at Allegheny College, where he teaches acting, voice and movement. He worked as a professional actor and director in New York City for 13 years. He has acted at the Public Theatre, Women's Interart Theatre, the Guthrie Theatre, on television and in film. He taught acting at the University of Georgia and in Madison, Wisconsin, where he received his MFA from the University of Wisconsin.

### **Roberta Levine**

worked as an actress and performance artist in New York City for many years. She taught acting workshops to adults and young people in Madison, Wisconsin; Athens, Georgia; and northwestern Pennsylvania. Currently, she teaches acting to gifted high school students.

### **Betsy Sumerfield**

graduated with a B.A. in communication arts/theatre from Allegheny College. She went on to earn her master's degree in theater and dance from American University in Washington, D.C. Betsy currently teaches dance at Allegheny College, where she is also the advisor for JADE, a jazz dance performance group. She teaches at Allegro Dance Arts, movement at the ARC, theatre and character development for high school and middle school enrichment programs and was a Pennsylvania Roster Artist. Some of Betsy's more recent awards include Educator of the Year from the ARC of Crawford County and the YWCA Woman of the Year for the Arts.

# About Allegheny College
